



RENTING THE SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER:

The Senior Center can be rented for special occasions: such as a bridal shower, rummage sale, family gathering, birthday party, anniversary party, graduation party, Christmas, etc.

The center can be rented on weekends, week nights, and may be rented during the week if we can make it work.

Dinning Room - \$100. plus \$100. deposit.

Note: Deposit is used to cover any cleaning charges or damage caused by renters. Deposit money will be returned if the center is cleaned and there is no damage.

SUPPORT YOUR SENIOR CENTER KITCHEN

Everyone is encouraged to come and have a NOON MEAL at the Breckenridge Senior Center. Suggested meal cost is \$7.00. Noon meals will be served, Monday to Friday at 11:00-12:00. If you wake up and decide you would like to have noon lunch at the center, please call the Center (643-5730) before 8:00 a.m. It would be best if you would inform us the day before your planned meal.

Look over the menu, pick a couple of days and make plans to eat at the center those days.

DAILY ACTIVITIES -

Pinochle each Tuesday 1:00 PM, Bingo each Wednesday 1:00 PM Whist each Thursday at 1:00 PM.

PINOCHLE, Tuesday 1:00 P.M. - There is normally five - six tables of players each week. Each player pays \$1.00 to play. There is a small cash price for the top three

players each week. Everyone enjoys playing cards, visiting and having lunch when they are done at about 4:00 p.m.

BINGO, Wednesday 1:00 P.M. - There is a charge 50 cents per card for the day and you can play as many cards as you would like.

We play a total of twenty different games. Each game winner receives a dollar. The 12th game is blackout, if you get blackout before a curtain number of numbers are called you will get \$25.00. If you get the first blackout but it is over the number of numbers called you will receive \$3.00. We have a small lunch after we play blackout. We play seven more games after lunch. We are normally done by 3:00 p.m.

WHIST, Thursday 1:00 PM - If you are interested in playing whist please call the center 218-643-5730. Your name will be added to a players list and you will be called when players are needed.

There is normally three - five tables of players each week. Each player pays \$1.00 to play. There is a small cash price for the top three players each week.

AFTERNOON LUNCH (Game Day) - I would like to see all game players take there turn providing-bringing lunch. We have a sign up sheet on the bulletin board next to the office. Please pick a date, and let us know the date by signing the lunch sign up sheet. If you are not able to make something, maybe you could buy something. It is a snack not a meal.

MEMBERSHIP DUES - BSC membership year is January 1 to December 31. If you want to remain a member please pay your 2025 membership. Yearly membership is \$20.00 or you could get a lifetime membership for \$150.

DONATIONS - If yo u have extra money and you are looking for a not-for-profit organization please consider donation to the Breckenridge Senior Citizens Center. We are a not-for-profit 501c public Agencies. This would be a great way to help the center.
