A. Whimsey Bark Houses - Derek Epping (West Fargo, ND) Students will carve a cottonwood bark house or light house. Instructor will cover how to start the project & putting in doors, windows, steps, ladders & chimneys. Tools needed: knife, V-tools (medium #3 & #9, small #3) & any other tools you like, plus a carving glove & thumb guard. Cost of class is \$35 (plus cost of the bark @ \$10-\$30). Experienced - Beginner - Advanced. Class size 10





B. Bark-atecture Whimsey Houses - Norm Minske (Papillion, NE) Students may either bring previous bark carvings or start a new one in class. Norm will demonstrate a variety of Bark-atecture techniques including opening/closing doors, framed windows, decks, stairs/steps, multi-level platforms, dormers, ladders & structural bracing. Individual project subject matter is flexible & may include rustic houses, churches, castles, lighthouses, barns, etc. Experienced bark carvers recommended but not required. Class cost is \$60. Cottonwood Bark (\$10-\$25), Cryo glue, accelerator & miniature milled bark lumber for purchase. Class size 10.



<u>C. Rosemaling – Alan Pearson (Fargo, ND)</u> The project will be a 10" plate painted in the American Rogaland style on a dark green background. This style, where scrolls are dominant, has several lines of symmetry with a central root. Painting supplies provided. Students are encouraged to bring any painting materials that they may have. Beginner - Advanced. <u>Cost of the class is \$40 plus \$15 for the plate.</u> Class size 10.



<u>D. Carving Beautiful & Useable Spoons - Karen Henderson (St. Francis, MN)</u> Students will create truly unique spoons that are as functional as they are beautiful. The wood is carved green (wet). Variety of hardwoods: Buckthorn, Apple, Lilac & other woods available. All have a beautiful grain & unique color. Basic hand tools used. <u>Cost of class is \$35 (Includes 1 blank)</u> Other blanks available. Beginner - Advanced. Class size 10.



**E. Chip Carving - Jan Jenson (Eau Claire, WI)** Old World chip carving is easy to learn & is considered to be quite relaxing. Many projects to choose from. Beginners might make coasters, a rolling pin or small box, while returning students may challenge themselves with one of the slightly more difficult plates, like the "3-D star" or "Going in Circles." Protective glove. May bring extra light & magnifier. All other supplies provided. **Cost of class is \$35 (plus cost of projects \$5-\$40)** Beginner - Advanced. Class size 10.







F. Photorealistic Colored Pencil - Rhonda Smith (Hawley, MN) Students will be creating a "Photorealistic Colored Pencil drawing" of a Bright Mum. Step by step instructions. No prior experience necessary! One on one assistance will be given. You will leave with a complete drawing. G. Caricatures - Bruce Ankeny (Blue Earth, MN) Projects will be choice of caricatures to carve from basswood cutouts. (Santas, Hippies, Pigs, Gnomes & many more.) Palm tools, bench knife & carving glove needed. Bruce will demonstrate his painting techniques. Paint & brushes provided. Cost of class is \$65 (plus cost of blank, \$25-\$40). Intermediate - Advanced. Class size 10







H. Flying Owl Relief - Rick Brereton (Manitoba, Canada) Rick's newest relief project, a feisty flying owl, will challenge carvers. It will be carved in high relief on a 14" X 11" X1" basswood panel. Rick will demonstrate structured removal of waste wood, control of depth, layering of levels & undercutting. Carving techniques, finishing & presentation options will be discussed. Palm or Long edge tools only - no power or sanding. Tool List / Carving Equipment or questions - Contact Rick at <a href="mailto:rebrereton@gmail.com">rebrereton@gmail.com</a>. Cost of class is \$50. (Includes 1 blank) Advanced Beginner - Advanced. Class size 10.



I. Red Fox - Roger Nadrchal (Norfolk, NE) Class project will be a red fox that is about 6" tall carved from a basswood roughout. Carved with power & some hand tools. Each student is required to bring their own power tools & dust collector. Roger will teach carving techniques, fur texture & woodburning. Please bring your own reference pictures & brushes. Time may not allow for painting; however, the process will be discussed & brief demo given. Bases will be available for purchase. Contact Roger at 402-750-5591 or wood\_chips@yahoo.com with any questions. Class Cost is \$90 (plus roughout \$25) Experienced - Advanced. Class size 10.





<u>J. Green Man - Izo Becic (Moorhead, MN)</u> Izzo is a European trained Master Carver. His carving, using his own blank, will be a project in architectural carving design. Students have choice of project depending on skill level. Izo will call students to verify choice. Tools required: gouges, mallet & at least 2 to 4 clamps for securing blank to table. Tools will be available to use & for sale. <u>Cost of class is \$75-\$85. (includes blank)</u> Intermediate - Advanced. Class size 10.





K. Layered Landscapes/Owl - Ken Ramler (Sartel, MN) Students will carve a basswood flying owl, sitting Snowy owl or tree & rock arrangement, using hand tools. Paints, fasteners & landscape supplies included. Cost of class is \$40 (plus cost of blank - \$6 and Up) Beginner - Advanced. Class size 10.







L. Rusty Nail Shorebird - Dick Skauge (Lake Park, MN) This hand held carving project will be carved in butternut or basswood. The body is about 11" X 3" x 3". We will use palm tools. Bring the tools you have & a carving glove. The beak and leg are pole barn nails, We will insert glass eyes. Call with questions: Dick Skauge (701-236-8262). Cost of Class is \$50 (includes blank and supplies) Experienced Beginner - Advanced. Class Size 10.



M. Quilting & Crafting - Marilyn Orgaard (Bismarck, ND) The Friendship Star blocks in this fun quilt are constructed with an unusual, yet easy technique. The quilt measures 59" x 72". Contact Marilyn Orgaard at 701-595-2530 or <a href="mkorgaard@gmail.com">mkorgaard@gmail.com</a> with questions regarding fabric requirements & quilting supplies. Class project fee is \$25. The classroom is also open to those choosing to work on their own quilting or crafting project.



N. Beginning Wood Carving - Patty Molm (Fargo, ND) This class is for the student that has minimal or no experience carving in wood. Students will learn carving safety, handling tools, reading the wood grain, carving strokes & much more. The project is an owl carved from basswood. Difficulty level adjusted, based on how detailed you make the carving. There will be a painting demonstration to show how to finish your carving. Smaller blank sizes are available. Students have the option of carving either 1 or 2 days. (See last page of registration form) for class times and costs for taking the class.



MASSAGE CHAIRS: This year we again are planning on having massage therapists that will be doing chair massages for 10-30 minutes, at \$1.00/minute. (Cash only!) Students would sign up for an appointment at the registration desk. Massages would be conducted on Saturday during the day. If we have enough people interested in utilizing the service, we will book them. Please indicate your interest in possibly utilizing their services during the seminar on your registration form.

**Resident Halls** Accommodations are double or single rooms. Sheets, towels, washcloths, pillows,

pillowcases and extra blankets will be furnished. The residence hall, and the

classrooms, are air conditioned. Dress in warm layers of clothes!

Room Dorm assignments, class locations and schedule of events will be handed out when you

register. Rooms are available Sunday night for \$40 for single room & \$30 for a double.

Meals

The first meal, included in the seminar fee, will be Friday night. NDSCS will have lunch available on Friday (at your own expense) for anyone coming in earlier and

needing to eat before registration starts. Please indicate on form your intention to eat on campus for Friday lunch. Payment can be made to NDSCS directly at the dining center. The final seminar meal will be Sunday at noon. Your NAME TAG should be worn at

all times. It is your pass to all meals and activities.

**Keys**Keys for your room and the dormitory door will be given out at registration by a Dorm

on Monday morning.

All unreturned keys will be billed to the student at a cost of \$75/Key.

Classes Classes start Friday afternoon about 2:00PM, after check-in. Depending on the travel

Cancellation After May 25, 2025, there will be a \$60.00 charge for anyone dropping out of the

workshop for any reason. The charge includes administration fees and reimbursing the instructor for the class blank made for you. (Blank to be used in a weekend seminar drawing.) After **June 6, 2025**, there will be no refunds. The balance of your paid registration fees will be credited for use for the following year's seminar. Cancellations for medical reasons will be handled on an individual case basis. If you have to cancel,
