Crew Updates

Electric:

Public Services Director Crocker presented to the commissioners that Oregon has been trenched and that next week wire will be pulled on New York Ave.

Water:

A valve for the slaker stopped working, the auto function went out and it needs to be worked manually. The valve costs \$5,000 to replace, Crocker asked for a motion to buy an extra one to have on reserve in the chance that the new one goes out. Valve Replacement on NY Ave Project:

Public Utility Situation:

Public Services Director Crocker presented to the commissioners that two water employees are on corrective action due to damaging a citizen's dryer on the job, Crocker informed the commissioners that Breckenridge Public Utilities would buy a new dryer for him/her.

Meter Tampering:

Public Services Director Crocker informed the commissioners a citizen had electric disconnected, but he decided to reconnect the meter and damaged it in the process. Crocker informed the commissioners he will be pressing charges against the individual.

Public Services Director Crocker presented to the commissioners that he wants to have new apprentices sign a contract to stay with BPU upon completion of the apprenticeship program since Breckenridge Public Utilities pays for the schooling. Discussion was had, Crocker will have Jason draft a contract to present to the Union to ensure it is in compliance.
