



HYROID THINGS YOU NEED **TO KNOW**

If you currently take thyroid medication but are still gaining weight and still have a variety of symptoms, there's more you need to know. 



Welcome to a new school year of Early Child-hood Family Education (ECFE). For those new to ECFE, we are a multigenerational program where parents and their children, birth to kindergarten entrance, come for weekly classes to learn and grow together. You are your child's first and most important teacher! ECFE classes support you in this essential role. ECFE classes are designed for you and your child and is unique to Minnesota and is a program of the Breckenridge Public School's Community Education. Registration for ECFE classes is ongoing. You are welcome to join our classes anytime during the school year, space permitting. Residents from Breckenridge, Wahpeton and other communities are welcome!

THE COMPONENTS OF MOST ECFE CLASSES ARE:

Growing Together: For You and Your Child Half of each class is devoted to activities planned by a licensed early childhood teacher for parents and children to explore together. Together you can enjoy learning through art, music, stories and a variety of developmental activities. It is an opportunity to learn new ideas, games and activities that you can do at home.

Growing Independently: For Your Child

The remaining portion of each class is for children to have fun learning through play using art, movement, games and stories with the licensed early childhood teacher, the classroom assistant and the other children. New friendships are formed and children discover aspects of "me" while they learn apart from you. The goal of the children's program is to develop a healthy self-concept and a joy of learning.

Growing Confidently: For You

While children take part in the children's program, parents join with other parents in an informal group setting for discussion time led by a licensed parent educator. Being a parent is enjoyable, complex, and at times, stressful. Parents have the opportunity to choose and discuss current family topics, share ideas and concerns and feel encouraged by the support of others.

When registering two children for the same ECFE class, pay half the fee for the second child aged one year and over for classes meeting more than one time. No family who resides in the district will be denied participation because of inability to pay. 

Dear Breckenridge Community Members,



Indoor Air Quality

The Breckenridge Public school district has written indoor air quality (IAQ) management plan that describes our on-going effort to monitor and improve the air quality in our buildings. James Grawe is our IAQ coordinator, responsible for seeing that the management plan is implemented to prevent as many IAQ problems as possible and to quickly respond to any IAQ problems that may arise. Asbestos Notification

In accordance with federal regulations, the Breckenridge Public Schools have a management plan documenting the location and condition of all known or assumed asbestos containing materials (ACM) in the buildings. Every six months, an accredited inspector visually inspects the condition of the ACM. Also, every three years a re-inspection of the ACM is completed where all ACM is inspected, measured, and verified on maps with their locations. A six-month surveillance was completed on 8-7-2024 by an accredited inspector and management planner from Lakes Country Service Cooperative. The management plan is available for public inspection at the school office during normal business hours. Jerry Rosenthal is the designated person responsible for maintaining the asbestos management plans for the district. Jerry Rosenthal can be reached at 218-643-6822 with any questions.

Notice of Pesticide Use

A Minnesota state law went into effect in year 2000 that requires schools to inform parents and guardians if they apply certain pesticides on school property. Specifically, this law requires schools that apply these pesticides to maintain an estimated schedule of pesticide applications and to make the schedule available to parents and guardians for review or copying. State law also requires that you be told that the long-term health effects on children from the application of such pesticides or the class of chemicals to which they belong may not be fully understood. An estimated schedule of pesticides is available at the Administration Office. Parents of students may request to receive, at their expense, prior notification of pesticide applications made on days other than those specified in the estimated schedule (excluding emergency applications). Lead in Water

The Breckenridge School District will follow the recommendations of the Minnesota Department of Health's "Lead Contamination Control in School Drinking Water Guidance Manual." The Breckenridge School District completed lead in water testing during the 2023-2024 school year. The results of testing are available upon request. Re-testing will be completed during the 2024-2025 school year.

Policy 404 Employment & Services Criminal History Background Checks - No-tice to Parents/Guardians

The school district has adopted a policy, the purpose of which is to promote the physical, social, and psychological well-being of its students.

Pursuant to this policy, the school district shall seek criminal history background checks for all applicants who receive an offer of employment with the school district. The school district also shall seek criminal history background checks for all individuals, except enrolled student volunteers, who are offered the opportunity to provide athletic coaching services or other extracurricular academic coaching services to the school district, regardless of whether compensation is paid. These positions include, but are not limited to, all athletic coaches, extracurricular academic coaches, assistants, advisors and overnight chaperones. The school district may elect to seek criminal history background checks for other volunteers, independent contractors, and student employees.

Policy 413 Harassment and Violence

The purpose of this policy is to maintain a learning and working environment that is free from harassment and violence on the basis of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, age, marital status, familial status, status with regard to public assistance, sexual orientation, or dis-ability.

Policy 514 Bullying Prohibition Policy

A safe and civil environment is needed for students to learn and attain high academic standards and to promote healthy human relationships. Bullying, like other violent or disruptive behavior, is conduct that interferes with a student's ability to learn and/or a teacher's ability to educate students in a safe environment. The school district cannot monitor the activities of students at all times and eliminate all incidents of bullying between students, particularly when students are not under the direct supervision of school personnel. However, to the extent such conduct affects the educational environment of the school district and the rights and welfare of its students and is within the control of the school district in its normal operations, the school district intends to prevent bullying and to take action to investigate, respond to, and to remediate and discipline for those acts of bullying which have not been successfully prevented. The purpose of this policy is to assist the school district in its goal of preventing and responding to acts of bullying, intimidation, violence, reprisal, retaliation, and other similar disruptive and detrimental behavior. This policy meets the requirements of the 2014 bullying and safe schools act.

Policy 534 Unpaid Meal Charges

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that students receive healthy and nutritious meals through the school district's nutrition program. When a student's meal account reaches zero, a student may not charge further meals or a la carte items until the account has sufficient funds. The school district will make reasonable efforts to communicate with families to re-solve the matter of meal account balances that are low or fall below zero. The school district may provide an alternate meal that meets federal and state requirements to a student who does not have sufficient funds in the student's account or cannot pay cash for a meal. Families will be notified of a low balance once the balance reaches \$20.00. Negative balances of -\$20.00 may be turned over for collection. Policies are available for review at the District Office.


