Driving has changed since you first got your license, and taking the SMART driver course is presented by AARP Driver Safety to seniors to assist them to stay safe drivers, taking into account all the changes that occur as they age. Upon completion to take to their insurance agents as proof of attending the course. The AARP SMART Driver Course is recognized by Minnesota Drivers & Vehicle Services as an approved accident prevention course for drivers 50 years of age and older. Insured drivers 50 years of age and older may be eligible for an appropriate reduction in automobile insurance premium charges valid for three years after completing this course. Please check with your insurance company or agent for any additional requirements for eligibility.

Please bring your Driver's License, AARP Membership Card, and your United Health Care Supplement Card to class if applicable. Will need to verify Membership and Supplement Coverage for Discounted Class Fee.
